## Island Manager's Comments

**Election Results:** The results to change the date of the Annual Town Meeting are as follows.

A yes vote was for changing the date, a no vote was to remain the same.

### 28 no votes, 16 yes votes.

The Annual Town Meeting will remain on the Saturday of Columbus Day weekend. This year the meeting will be held on October 11th at the Community Center at 9 am.

**Long Beach:** There have been a few calls regarding the Long Beach swim rope. It was decided that the safety rope for the swim area would be moved to the marina entrance and down approximately 75% of the beach distance. Safety for swimmers, litter, and destruction of trees and bushes were our major concerns. The result is now a cleaner more pristine beach for residents and their guests. It is also now easier for Public Safety to patrol this area where there is boat access.

**Litter:** I have noticed an increase on the amount of bottles, cans, and paper products along our roads the past few weeks. I ask you all to do your **"Due Diligence"** to keep our island clean.

**Special note:** On Saturday August 2<sup>nd</sup> at 9 am, prior to the start of the softball tournament, there will be a special presentation at the ball field. We would appreciate a good attendance.

**NIXLE:** Our NIXLE system is up and running. This system will notify all subscribers of important / emergency notices in their selected areas via text, web, and email. The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. However, in order to access the notices you will be required to subscribe. You can subscribe by going to their website at [www.nixle.com](http://www.nixle.com) and following the prompts. A test notice was sent yesterday to those that have enrolled. I would encourage everyone to subscribe to this service. It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island.

**Pickleball:** Pickleball, similar to tennis but different, is catching on in a lot of places around the country and here on Frye Island as well. I have been asked to mention that there will be a group of Islanders playing from 9AM to 11AM every Monday, Wednesday & Friday on the courts on Lancaster Loop (near the pool). Everyone is welcome to play whether you've played before or not.

**Internet Access:** A number of Islanders have inquired about possibility of getting internet access at the Community Center and we do have Wi-Fi there. It is presently a secure connection but if the Community Center is open, you can get the password from the person there in charge.



# Here We Go Again! USS Zumwalt Day on Frye Island



After a one-year pause, a new ship is completing its construction at the Bath Iron Works, providing us with the opportunity to welcome its sailors for a day of R&R here on Frye Island. Sailors from three previous ships have all loved it, as have the Islanders who hosted them.

This ship is the first of a new class of destroyer, the USS Zumwalt, DDG 1000. It's half again as big as the older Arleigh Burke class, with half the crew, because of increased automation. It's really impressive, and it's commanded by no less than Captain James Kirk!

Save the date on your calendar, Saturday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, as we'll be looking for Islanders to help out.

As before, we will start with a welcoming ceremony and ballgame in the late morning, followed by a barbecue lunch and informal recreation in the afternoon, including swimming, boating and kayaking, golf, basketball, soccer, volleyball, and tennis. We will close the day by inviting groups of two to four sailors, as well as others with their young families, to the homes of Islanders for supper and relaxation. ### TRANSFER STATION

Household Trash and Recycling Compactors can not accept the following items:

Latex and oil paints, Motor oils, Wood, Metal, Electronics, Mirrors, Luggage, Lamps, Rugs, Hairdryers, Radios, Pots and Pans, Ceramic Lamps, Bedding, Clothing, Flotation devices, Life Jackets, Tarps, TV Converters, etc.. These items are considered either demolition, metal, hazardous or bulk type materials. If you have any questions on certain items, the Transfer Station Attendant will be there to assist you.

- 1). The American Flag should be given to the TS Attendant when it is being thrown away.
- 2). Boxes should be broken down before bringing them to the TS. This will help assist with a timely turn at the compactors.
- 3). Household trash should be stored in trash bags, otherwise trash not in bags may be turned away.
- 4). Trash bags should be tied, for this will help elevate issues with flies, etc..
- 5). AA/AAA/C & D Batteries as well as grill coals may go into household trash.

- 6). Fluorescent bulbs are considered Universal Waste and should not go into household trash.
  - 7). Recycle emblem 1 through 7 are able to go into the recycle compactor. Any item not reflecting one of these numbers will go into the demolition dumpster.
  - 8). Small Propane fuel cans are not recyclable. These are considered special waste. An area has been designated for these items.
  - 9). No vehicle tires are accepted at the TS.
  - 10). Asbestos roofing/siding is not accepted at the TS.
- Please save your coffee cans for the TS Attendant.

#### Recycling Tips - What NOT to include:

Plastic bags, Food Liners, Unmarked Plastics (laundry baskets/chairs/toys), Window and Refrigerator Glass, Mirrors, Light Bulbs, Dishes, Pyrex, Ceramics, Foam Packaging, Styrofoam, Hazardous Material or Universal Waste, Recyclable Containing Food Waste, All Cans Must Be Empty and Non-Hazardous
