## Island Manager's Comments

### Office Hours

Effective August 2<sup>nd</sup> 2014, the office will be closed on Tuesdays for training.

The Treasurer Wayne Fournier and Assistant Town Clerk Lisa Kerrigan will be working together to train the New Town Manager and Town Clerk on all of Frye Island's procedures and protocols. We have waited until after the busy season in the office to do this training. Please be patient, there is a great deal of information and records to learn and digest.

### Ferry Tolls

It has been brought to my attention that a few island residents are not replenishing their ferry accounts after they are triggered by email for a low balance. I urge all residents to add an "ACH" account for this purpose. It takes all the thinking out of the process. For those of you residents that refuse to do the automatic replenishment, it becomes your own responsibility to replenish by mail or a visit to the office. Presently we have Islanders who are in arrears in their accounts. This is not acceptable practice or fair to the responsible island residents and families.

Effective on August 1, 2014 there will be no passage on the ferry if your account balance is below your toll fare. The vehicle or passenger will be charged at Tier 3 rates with no exception.

The Captains, mates, and all other ferry employees have been advised of this change. I would also appreciate the islanders to treat our employees with the respect that they have earned and deserve. If anyone has a complaint about the policy change I am certainly willing to hear their thoughts.

### Long Beach

There have been a few calls regarding the Long Beach swim rope. It was decided that the safety rope for the swim area would be moved to the marina entrance and down approximately 75% of the beach distance. Safety for swimmers, litter, and destruction of trees and bushes were our major concerns. The result is now a cleaner more pristine beach for residents and their guests. It is also now easier for Public Safety to patrol this area where there is boat access.

### Litter

I have noticed an increase on the amount of bottles, cans, and paper products along our roads the past few weeks. I ask you all to do your "Due Diligence" to keep our island clean.

On Saturday August 2<sup>nd</sup> at 9:15 am, prior to the start of the softball tournament, there will be a special presentation at the ball field. We would appreciate a good attendance.

It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island.

The farmers' market continues this week as we enter into the month of August (is it August already?!). If you have not yet had the chance to check out the farm stand, we restock it each Thursday with great produce that is wonderfully fresh and is sourced to the greatest extent from local Maine farms. Take advantage of the opportunity to add some locally grown corn, sugar snap peas or some herbs to your home cooked meals. When you come down, also be sure to check out our selection of items from Stonewall Kitchen, a local manufacturer of gourmet grocery items. We have stocked a number of items ranging from maple syrup to jams to salsas to spice up the dining experience. And each week we are trying to feature a recipe utilizing the fresh produce and items from Stonewall Kitchen. We share these recipes on our facebook page. Be sure to see what's cookin'!

By the time the FINS is published, our allocation of Hop Swap, Sebago Brewing's wildly popular limited release fall beer, will be gone. We received two kegs and they have gone quite quickly. But not to despair, we will be replacing Hop Swap with some very special beers. We will be adding to the tap list Piraat, a strong Belgian golden ale considered to be a top 10 beer in the world, and Slumbrew's imperial cream ale My Better Half, with half of the fermentation completed as a cold lager and the other half done as a warm ale. And if you enjoyed Slumbrew's Lobstah Killah, we are happy to have a limited supply of 22oz bottles for sale in the store. Looking ahead we are targeting Saturday August 23 for a Sebago Brewing Tap Takeover. In addition to our best selling Frye's Leap IPA, we will be featuring other fine brews from Sebago Brewing. More details to follow. And, we are also planning another fun event, a beer tasting that is targeted for Thursday August 14. Space/seating will be limited. Look for more details down at the café in the coming days. We had such an event last year and it was very well received!

If beer is not your thing, be sure to check out the expanded selection of wine that we have available. The list of wines beyond our normal house wine can be found on the tabletop menu cards at each table. We hope that you are able to find something that you like! Specials keep rotating thru the menu so be sure to check with your server what we are serving that day. Also back on the menu after a brief absence due to supply issues are clams. Come down and satisfy your hankering for some freshly fried whole belly clams! And at the bar, be sure to check out the specialty frozen drinks to choose from to cool off from the hot and humid weather.

This weekend is the island softball tournament. In addition to our plans to dominate the field of play and win the whole enchilada, we will be serving coffee and muffins in the morning and hot dogs and pizza later in the day down at the ball fields to satisfy your hunger, as well as cold drinks to quench your thirst. ## Here We Go Again! USS Zumwalt Day on Frye Island



After a one-year pause, a new ship is completing its construction at the Bath Iron Works, providing us with the opportunity to welcome its sailors for a day of R&R here on Frye Island. Sailors from three previous ships have all loved it, as have the Islanders who hosted them.

This ship is the first of a new class of destroyer, the USS Zumwalt, DDG 1000. It's half again as big as the older Arleigh Burke class, with half the crew, because of increased automation. It's really impressive, and it's commanded by no less than Captain James Kirk!

Save the date on your calendar, Saturday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, as we'll be looking for Islanders to help out.

As before, we will start with a welcoming ceremony and ballgame in the late morning, followed by a barbecue lunch and informal recreation in the afternoon, including swimming, boating and kayaking, golf, basketball, soccer, volleyball, and tennis. We will close the day by inviting groups of two to four sailors, as well as others with their young families, to the homes of Islanders for supper and relaxation.
