Last Saturday Frye Island hosted the crew and families of this first of a new class of destroyers. I want to thank everyone that hosted families and single sailors. I also want to thank the volunteers that helped make this event a success.

The office will remain closed on Tuesdays except for Code Enforcement.

Ferry Tolls

It has been brought to my attention that a few island residents are not replenishing their ferry accounts after they are triggered by email for a low balance. I urge all residents to add an "ACH" account for this purpose. It takes all the thinking out of the process. For those of you residents that refuse to do the automatic replenishment, it becomes your own responsibility to replenish by mail or a visit to the office. Presently we have Islanders who are in arrears in their accounts. This is not acceptable practice or fair to the responsible island residents and families.

Effective on August 1, 2014 there will be no passage on the ferry if your account balance is below your toll fare. The vehicle or passenger will be charged at Tier 3 rates with no exception.

The Captains, mates, and all other ferry employees have been advised of this change. I would also appreciate the islanders to treat our employees with the respect that they have earned and deserve. If anyone has a complaint about the policy change I am certainly willing to hear their thoughts.

NIXLE: Our NIXLE system is up and running. This system will notify all subscribers of important / emergency notices in their selected areas via text, web, and email. The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. However, in order to access the notices you will be required to subscribe. You can subscribe by going to their website at www.nixle.com and following the prompts. A test notice was sent yesterday to those that have

enrolled. I would encourage everyone to subscribe to this service. It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island.

Internet Access: A number of Islanders have inquired about possibility of getting internet access at the Community Center and we do have Wi-Fi there. It is presently a secure connection but if the Community Center is open, you can get the password from the person there in charge.

If you are a Smashed Pumpkin fan, be sure to get some while you can as supply is tight and we expect that it will be difficult to keep this beer routinely on draft. Two beer events remain over the balance of the summer. The first will be a tap takeover with Sebago Brewing on Saturday August 23. In addition to our best selling Frye's Leap IPA, we will be featuring other fine brews from Sebago Brewing. A brewer's rep will be onsite and I am sure that there will be swag to go around! And our final event will be a beer tasting on Friday August 29 from 3pm to 5pm. We will be highlighting beers from two west coast brewers, Rogue and Uinta. Rogue is one of the most innovative craft brewers in the US and Uinta makes an outstanding selection of beers, several of which we have had on tap over the last two seasons. 
