### **Selectmen position**

You must be a registered voter of the Town of Frye Island to run for this position. To date we do not have any candidates.

### **Executive Committee**

There are three seats on the Executive Committee up for election. Two seats are for a 3 year term, and one seat is for a one year term.

The qualifications are as follows.

1. US Citizen
2. 18 years of age
3. An owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

### **Biographies of candidates**

### **Deliveries of FedEx and UPS packages.**

The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. However, in order to access the notices you will be required to subscribe. You can subscribe by going to their website at [www.nixle.com](http://www.nixle.com) and following the prompts. A test notice was sent yesterday to those that have enrolled. I would encourage everyone to subscribe to this service. It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island.

### **Ferry changes**

Starting this week we have made some changes in the town administration. Ronnie Ilich will be moving into the administration building in a new position handling Ferry Operations and Assistant Town Clerk.

All deliveries to the Island are the responsibility of the homeowners, contractor, and independent vendors. We have attached instructions for purchasing and printing or emailing tickets from your account.

The Ferry system is designed so that you may all be responsible for your own account. You have different options to prepare tickets for your deliveries. Any questions on ticket problems should be directed to the main office telephone number 655-4551.

Once again I strongly urge all users to open an ACH account at the office. An application can be found on the website under the Ferry Tab, "eTicket Information," "Account Application." Complete the Option 2 section, and attach a voided check. This can be brought to the office or mailed in.

### **Free Blood Pressure Check, First Aid**

The Towns EMS continues to offer free blood pressure checks. This service will be offered Monday through Friday 10:00am to Noon at the Ferry Landing Rescue Barn next to the Post Office. Please stop by and say hi to the EMT's that are working on the island.

Also offered at no charge will be routine first aid. So for anyone that has an injury that needs attention, stop by the Rescue Barn and have the EMT's take a look at your situation, or **call 893-2810** for non-emergency, **911 for emergency** and we'll come to you. As always, all patient care offered by Frye Island EMS will be at no charge, you will not get a bill. This is a service we are happy to offer to all islanders and visitors.

### **New NG 911 Addresses Coming Soon**

The Island's new address system mandated by the State is complete and will be released soon. What this means to an island home owner is that we will no longer be recognizing traditional lot numbers as a residence address. The island will be transitioning to the more traditional numbering system we all are familiar with at our mainland homes, with even numbers on one side of the street and odd numbers on the other side of the street. The lot number we are all accustomed to will not change, it will just no longer be your address. The anticipated roll out for this will be this fall. This information will be included with your tax bill. The new address system will be given to the phone company to be input after the island closes this Fall 2014, and will be in full effect when we all return to the island in the spring of 2015. The new street number placards will be purchased by the Town and will be uniform for every residence. Installation of the numbering system is under consideration by the Board as to how to smoothly facilitate the change.

This change in numbering is an important improvement for a number of reasons. This will facilitate quicker response from your Police, Fire and EMS Departments. This will also allow island addresses to be input within phone company software so emergency dispatch centers can give accurate address locations to emergency personnel for emergency situations. And last but not least this change will finally make sense of our address system.

We continue our march into the Fall season but hopefully we do so with sunny, late summer weather! And hopefully some good weather will bring some guests down to the store and café. It was nice to be able to catch our breath at the end of the high season but it is starting to get pretty lonely around here during the week!

The café remains open on weekends with full service starting Friday at 2:00pm and ending Sunday at 6:00pm. On Saturdays we have college football on in the bar and pro football on Sundays. Come on down and have another Frye's Leap IPA or Switchback Ale before the season is done-done. We just ordered several additional kegs so we do have beer to serve! And remarkably, we still have most of the menu available. Steak bombs, chicken fajitas, grilled shrimp tacos, still all there. And of course we still have pizza.
