## Island Manager's Comments

**Office closed Saturday morning, 10/11/14 for the Annual Town Meeting. Will reopen one hour after the completion of the meeting.**

### E911 Addresses

The E911 addresses will be in effect when the island opens in April of 2015. You will be able to find your number on a website posting to be done during the off season. Your numbers will be installed by the Town of Frye Island.

### Town office move:

The office will be relocating to the Ferry Trailer for the winter season on October 28, 2014. We would appreciate your completing any unfinished business by the close of business on Saturday, October 25, 2014.

It usually takes 3-5 days to get the operation up and running smoothly.

### Property tax procedure.

The Town of Frye Island mails out your annual property tax bills the first week of November. At the bottom of each bill there are two remittance coupons. The first payment is due by December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year mailed. The second remittance is due by June 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year. If you have an unpaid balance after June 30<sup>th</sup> a certified letter is mailed to your address on file as a 30 day notice. After the lapse of an additional 30 days the liens are attached to the property in arrears. After 17 months the property owner will receive another notification warning of foreclosure. 30 days later the subject property will be foreclosed.

**Long Beach Marina:** Last day is **October 19, 2014**. The docks will be removed on Monday October 20, 2014.

### Selectmen position

There is one Selectman seat up for election. You must be a registered voter of the Town of Frye Island to run for this position. To date we have two candidates.

### Biography of Selectman candidates

**Dale Frechette** is seeking his first term as Town Selectman. He is self-employed in the excavation business and joined the island community just three seasons ago. He and his wife Beth have two children, a daughter, Michaela and son Boone. They live in Harrison, Maine. Beth is a Registered Nurse at Stephens Memorial Hospital in Norway, Maine. Michaela is a Licensed Esthetician, and Boone works in the family business with Dale.

Dale feels he is a good listener and has worked well with Code Enforcement, DPW, and other Town leaders to help the island community grow. Dale has made many friends on the island and would like to be a voice for everyone and their concerns.

**Ron Cedrone** is seeking his first term as Town Selectman. He is a self-employed Optometrist, who practices in South Portland and lives in Cumberland, Maine with his wife Ellen. Ron and his family have been members of the Frye Island community since 2004. In addition to a busy professional life, Ron has served on the Frye Island Planning Board, and Comprehensive Plan Committee since 2008, and has been a volunteer during the construction of Frye

Island's new Town Hall. Ron's goal is to work to keep Frye Island the special place that we all enjoy.

### **Executive Committee**

There are three seats on the Executive Committee up for election. Two seats are for a 3 year term, and one seat is for a two year term.

The qualifications are as follows.

1. US Citizen
2. 18 years of age
3. An owner or a spouse of an owner of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person, maximum two people per fixed home.

### **Biographies of Executive Committee candidates seeking three year terms**

**Tim McCarthy** is seeking his second term. Tim with his wife Mary and two children have been members of the Frye Island Community since 1996. Tim has been employed in the computer industry for 35 years, holding many senior management positions during his career. In addition to a busy professional life, he has served on the Frye Island Marina committee for 12 years with 5 years as the Chairman. Tim also serves on the Frye Island Board of Appeals with 5 years as Chairman. He also serves as an EVOC volunteer ambulance driver.

Tim is also the captain of the Beach 5 softball team with 2 championships. The McCarthy family resides at 159 Leisure Lane. During the off season the family resides in Hampton, NH. Tim believes one should pay back their time to an environment such as the island, given the amount of pleasure it provides.

**Harry "Jay" Ledgard** has also taken out papers to run for Executive Committee. Jay, his wife Perri, and their two children Zach and Devynn have resided at 801 Beachview Drive for 13 years. During their time on Frye Island they have enjoyed the beaches, boating, and have made many lifelong friends. Jay looks forward to serving the Island in every way possible. He currently serves on the Board of Appeals and the Marina Committee.

In his professional life he serves as the Vice President of Sales for Century-Tywood in Holliston, MA. Jay believes that with his business experience and open minded thought process he can be very constructive in a well balanced approach for the future of Frye Island. Jay wants to assure that Frye Island remains the special place we all have grown to love. He believes this can be accomplished with planned growth while maintaining

the Island's unique character. In the off season his family resides in Sterling MA

**Bob Burbank** is seeking the three year term on the Executive Committee. Bob has been the Town Manager for Andover, CT for the past 9 years. He believes in efficiency in government. During his terms the tax rate has had no increase for five years and has been lowered in the last two years. He obtained and administrated more than \$2 million in federal and state grants for his town. Before serving as town manager he served on the Andover Planning and Zoning Commission as Chairman for 10 years, and the local Board of Education. Bob believes this experience will be beneficial to the town and the Executive Committee. He also served on the Frye Island Board of Directors in the early 90's. Bob had 20 years as a Fortune 500 Company Sales Manager and ran his own title searching business for five years.

Bob has been on the island since 1968 when his parents built. In 1975 he purchased the home from his mother. Since then Bob and his wife Marie have raised three sons and one daughter, spending each summer on the island. Now added to this group are their spouses and five grandsons who equally enjoy their summers on the island. Bob will be retiring in the near future and intends to move his residence to the island during the summers.

### **Biography of Executive Committee candidates seeking two year term**

**John Schutz** is seeking his first term on the Executive Committee. Frye Island has been his family retreat for the last 30 years. His kids spent their summers here; scooped ice cream, made pizza and went on to bigger jobs at the golf course and the road crews. They now work in Boston but always return years later with their kids. John presently serves as the Chairman of the Frye Island Board of Appeals.

She is currently Secretary of the Recreation Commission and has participated in special island projects such as the ferry barcode system. She makes a priority of volunteering with Island Recreation because the best thing about Frye Island is its community, and she is honored to help support community spirit. By regularly attending important island meetings during high season and the winter to stay informed and ask questions, Betsy is very knowledgeable about island issues. She will meet personally with Islanders and will use technology to reach out to anyone interested. The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. I would encourage everyone to subscribe to this service. It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island.

**MEMSRR 2014 Frye Island Rescue Service**

**EMS Stats**

In an effort to provide feedback and help improve the quality of the reports entered into the Maine EMS Run Reporting (MEMSRR) System, Maine EMS sends services quarterly progress reports. These reports will begin by focusing on Report Entry Time and Report Validity. This report looks at the preceding quarter and provides a snapshot of our services performance. The enclosed report is for 2014 season

**1. Report Entry Compliance**

Maine EMS rules require services and providers to enter patient care reports into the MEMSRR within 1 business day. For patient care purposes, services and providers should strive for as soon as possible! Providing a complete and timely run report is an essential part of providing quality patient care and is an obligation we have to each patient.

Providing a complete patient care report is the only skill we perform in every patient encounter. The information documented in a run report is an important part of the patient medical record and is invaluable in assisting with patient treatment decisions.

**Frye Island Rescue Service score-100%**

**Report Validity**

The MEMSRR validity rule system helps guide providers towards a complete report. The validity score helps administrators identify reports that are missing critical elements of a report; a lower score means that more elements are missing. Reports do not need to be 100% to be complete; however, this system helps identify reports that should be reviewed. Ideally, a service would have an average validity score between 80% and 100%.

Completed reports are utilized at a number of levels. A service can use this information for quality assurance and improvement activities to ensure the population of its coverage area are receiving the best care possible and resources are being utilized to their full potential. Hospitals use the reports to make clinical decisions and shape the care the patient receives both in the emergency room and after admission. Primary care physicians will use the information to determine the

care that is necessary to ensure proper care and safety for their patient when they return home.

Pre-hospital protocols are also influenced by the information documented on patient care reports. With each protocol revision, information from the EMS patient care report has been used to determine the effectiveness of treatments and provide insight on what EMS services and personnel are experiencing for calls in the field. This will help guide the Medical Direction and Practices Board (MDPB) to develop protocols enabling the safe and effective treatment of our patients.

For any of these benefits to occur, services must ensure that providers are entering a complete and accurate run report.


**Frye Island Rescue Service score-99.7%**

As of September 30, a survey of the Frye Island Rescue Service calls for patient care was averaged over an approximate 30 calls to date. I am pleased to report that the average time the Frye Island Rescue Service reaching a patient with a licensed EMT from tone out to on scene is **2 minutes 38 seconds**.

**New NG 911 Addresses Coming Soon**

The Island's new address system mandated by the State is complete and will be released soon. What this means to an island home owner is that we will no longer be recognizing traditional lot numbers as a residence address. The island will be transitioning to the more traditional numbering system we all are familiar with at our mainland homes, with even numbers on one side of the street and odd numbers on the other side of the street. The lot number we are all accustomed to will not change, it will just no longer be your address. The anticipated roll out for this will be this fall. This information will be included with your tax bill. The new address system will be given to the phone company to be input after the island closes this Fall 2014, and will be in full effect when we all return to the island in the spring of 2015. The new street number placards will be purchased by the Town and will be uniform for every residence. Installation of the numbering system is under consideration by the Board as to how to smoothly facilitate the change.

This change in numbering is an important improvement for a number of reasons. This will facilitate quicker response from your Police, Fire and EMS Departments. This will also allow island addresses to be input within phone company software so emergency dispatch centers can give accurate address locations to emergency personnel for emergency situations. And last but not least this change will finally make sense of our address system.


