July 4th weekend is upon us. The FINS contains all pertinent information under the specific departments for all events. Have fun, enjoy family and friends.

PLEASE NOTE: THERE WILL BE ONLY ONE FERRY FRIDAY, JULY 3RD UNTIL APPROXIMATELY 12 NOON OR LATER. ESSENTIAL REPAIRS ARE BEING DONE TO THE LLII TO GET THE BOAT 100%. THESE REPAIRS COULD NOT BE DONE SOONER AS THE PARTS WERE NOT AVAILABLE UNTIL NOW.

Property Taxes

Please remember Property Taxes were due June 30, 2015. The clock starts ticking on interest effective 7/1/2015.

Fireworks

The Frye Island fireworks display is scheduled for July 4th Saturday evening. Your **Contributions** for the show are greatly appreciated.

The fireworks will be off Long Beach on Saturday night the 4th at dusk. (8:45-9:15)

Reminder: if you have a boat in the Long Beach Marina in slip # 84 through #130 on the lake side or #67 through #131 on the causeway side, your boat MUST BE MOVED by 5PM to allow the pyro technicians the time to set up the display safely. Even if you don't have to move your boat and you are planning on viewing the fireworks from the lake, you must be out of the marina by 5 PM as well. The marina will reopen immediately following the fireworks display. In the event that poor weather postpones the event as it did last year a sign will be placed on the bulletin board.

Ferry

There will be additional hours for the second ferry on Sunday morning during high season beginning June 28th and ending September 6th. The second ferry will start at 10:00am instead of noon.

Park & Ride Appeal

The permit that was issued in April for the Park and Ride by the Planning Board for the Town of Raymond has been appealed by a group of aggrieved parties from both Raymond and Frye Island. I have requested our Webmaster to post this document for all interested parties.

As of 6/10/15, all brush brought to the Transfer Station shall not exceed 5 foot in total length. Brush longer than 5 foot will be turned away.

Town Office Hours

The office will be open Tuesday thru Saturday from 9 am to 3 pm. Please take advantage of the available on-line services to help keep the line short in the office during high season.

If you have a brand new registration for a boat, car, golf cart or trailer, please try to come during the week when the office is not as busy. Call ahead to be sure you have all the proper documents and discuss with the office staff the possibility of an appointment time to complete the new registrations. A new registration can take more than an hour and you may be asked to leave copies of your documents for the registration to be completed and picked up later in the day or another day. **Please note the office will be closed Sat., July 4th, 2015.**

Ferry Ride Requirements

To pay the toll on the ferry you need an E-Z Ride card, a paper ticket, an emailed ticket, or a picture of the E-Z ride card. The ferry employees are not responsible to type in numbers or take verbal requests to use another party's card for passage in any situation. Please provide family, guests, and any vendors you have with one of the above tools for ferry passage.

Package delivery protocol

All packages delivered by any courier service (UPS, FEDEX, etc.) will be delivered to the Post Office by 7 am the following day. You are responsible to track your own deliveries. If you have a package that is perishable, medicine, overnight delivery you have the right to free pedestrian passage to collect your package at the Ferry trailer once you track and it states delivered.

NIXLE

Our NIXLE system is up and running. This system will notify all subscribers of important / emergency notices in their selected areas via text, web, and email. The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. However, in order to access the notices you will be required to subscribe. You can subscribe by going to their website at www.nixle.com and following the prompts. I would encourage everyone to subscribe to this service. It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island

Variable Milfoil

Our new DASH machine is up and working. Our diver has advised me that he is removing 3-4 times the plants now. I also want to thank the volunteers that have offered to help fight this infestation. Long Beach marina has been targeted as one of four locations in Sebago for a new DEP grant to have other DASH teams come in and remove milfoil.

Fireworks Are Illegal On Frye Island

In 2011 the legislature voted to legalize fireworks in the State of Maine, the Governor signed the bill making it law. I'm still trying to wrap my head around this one. Fact; the most heavily forested state in the country, which is largely protected by volunteer fire departments now has to worry about people blowing things up in the often dry Maine woods.

During the October, 2011 Town Meeting, the Town voted to adopt a Town Ordinance making the use of fireworks illegal within the Town. This was done for several reasons, mainly to reduce the risk of personal injury, protecting the community of Frye Island from excessive fire danger, and the inconsiderate noise that not many people enjoy. Problem area in the past have been the Beach 3 & 5 areas, Long Beach and the area of the ballfield. Just a heads up, if anyone is caught illegally blowing off fireworks, they will be charged with a violation of the Towns fireworks ordinance. There will be no warning.



Free Blood Pressure Check, First Aid

As high season gets closer the Towns EMS service will be offering courtesy blood pressure checks. This service will be offered Monday through Friday 10:00am to Noon at the Ferry Landing Rescue Barn next to the Post Office. Please stop by and say hi to the EMTs that will

be working on the island this summer.

Also offered at no charge will be routine first aid. So for anyone that has an injury that needs attention, stop by the Rescue Barn and have the on duty EMT take a look at your situation, or **call 893-2810** for non-emergency, **911 for emergency** and we'll come to you. As always, all patient care offered by Frye Island EMS will be at no charge, you will not get a bill. This is a service we are happy to offer to all islanders and visitors.



Free Boater Safety Course





Frye Island Trail Map Information



The trails run thru Town owned property, Conservation areas, easements between privately owned lots and occasionally on lightly traveled Town roads. Please do not pick wildflowers or uproot plants.

Trails on the map are indicated by number, name and level of difficulty. They are marked at each end with signs  or colored streamers

The island is about 3 miles long and 1 mile at its widest and covers about 1000 acres. The trails on the undeveloped back nine of golf-course are approximations. There are some minor changes in elevation except for #12, the Chestnut Trail, which is very steep and needs to be descended very cautiously.

CAUTION. - Stay on the trails to avoid contact with poison ivy and ticks which may be carrying Lyme Disease.

Trail #1. Timber. Easy. Starts in Paddock Circle and joins an old access road that ends on Leisure Lane across from Beach 2, between lots 13 and 14.

Trail #2. Rec Beach. Easy. Starts across from Small Frye Island and enters a large meadow with chimney of the burned down rec hall. One arm leads to a fine beach called Rec Beach and to the right is a short road that leads to Ridge Road diagonally across from Trail #3.

Trail #3. Old Camp. Easy to moderate. Starts across from the driveway of Lot #1695 and runs parallel to Ridge Road until it runs behind the house on Lot #1874 and then across a wet area on to a short old road. It crosses the road to Leapview Circle and connects to #4, the Back Nine Trail.

Trail #4. Back Nine. Easy to moderate. This open-forested area is a pleasant walk with occasional deer sightings. It descends a hill that requires some caution and goes slightly uphill and crosses a lane that has been cleared for water lines. At the intersection beyond this juncture there is a sign that points to the Golf Clubhouse and the path to the left crosses a clear-cut area that is being developed into a driving range. This branch of the trail will be

obliterated when the driving range is completed and then the #5 Front Nine Trail will be reached by passing near the Clubhouse and going behind the hitting area of the driving range.

Trail #5. Front Nine. Easy. See above and map. This trail runs parallel to the fairway of the 1st hole until it ends at a golf-cart trail. Turn left at this point and walk until you reach either of two paths on the right. Both paths lead to the Potts' Trail.

Trail #6. Burgess. Easy. This is the name of the golfcart trail as described above.

Trail #7. Potts'. Easy. Turning onto the first right leads to a sign directing you to Twinview Circle, or going to the left, and eventually reaching an old road that ends on Ridge Road. A shorter and less confusing route is to continue straight on the Burgess Trail and take the path between the homes on Lot #1847 and Lot #1849 back onto Ridge Road.

Trail #8. Azalea Lagoon. Easy. Starts at the boat ramp at Long Beach Marina and runs along an old access road beside a placid lagoon without boat docks and it ends dead-ends in a peachful

mossy area on the edge of a Hemlock-Hardwood Pocket Hummock Swamp. This trail is w in the early spring, but it is usua passable.

Trail #9. Indian Lookout. Easy. This short trail leads to a clearin with a picnic table and an excel view of the lake.

Trail #10. Katherine's'. Easy. Starts across from the entrance Long Beach Marina trailer park area and continues along an easement between house lots until it reaches Harbor Lane. At this point, a left turn followed b a quick right onto Harbor Road leads to a pleasant walk all the to Leisure Lane across from Lot Beach 9, between Lots 237 and A right turn on to Harbor Lane l to the entrance to the Juniper-t Trail on Birch Road.

Trail #11. Juniper-Knoll. Easy. The entrance is obliquely across Birch Road where it meets Hart Burgess Lane. It runs gently uphill until a sharp right turn leads to Knoll's Circle and bearing slightly left leads to Juniper Circle.

Trail #12 Chestnut. Difficult. This very steep trail begins in Chestnut Circle just before the turn-around. After two areas of steep descent it ends at Birch R close to where it joins Leisure L
