If you have a brand new registration for a boat, car, golf cart or trailer, please try to come during the week when the office is not as busy. Call ahead to be sure you have all the proper documents and discuss with the office staff the possibility of an appointment time to complete the new registrations. A new registration can take more than an hour and you may be asked to leave copies of your documents for the registration to be completed and picked up later in the day or another day.

Ferry Ride Requirements

To pay the toll on the ferry you need an E-Z Ride card, a paper ticket, an emailed ticket, or a picture of the E-Z ride card. The ferry employees are not responsible to type in numbers or take verbal requests to use another party's card for passage in any situation. Please provide family, guests, and any vendors you have with one of the above tools for ferry passage.

NIXLE

Our NIXLE system is up and running. This system will notify all subscribers of important / emergency notices in their selected areas via text, web, and email. The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. However, in order to access the notices you will be required to subscribe. You can subscribe by going to their website at www.nixle.com and following the prompts. I would encourage everyone to subscribe to this service. It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island

New Signs (E911 numbers)

The DPW is presently installing the new numbers on Town property. Please do not move these signs after the installation. The signs are the property of the Town of Frye Island. These new NG 911 signs are standardized and placed a certain way at a designated height for a reason. Even though a sign has been installed, there may be some changes to your number as numbering issues get resolved.

Package delivery protocol

All packages delivered by any courier service (UPS, FEDEX, etc.) will be delivered to the Post Office by 7 am the following day. You are responsible to track your own deliveries. If you have a package that is perishable, medicine, overnight delivery you have the right to free pedestrian passage to collect your package at the Ferry trailer once you track and it states delivered.

Variable Milfoil

Our new DASH machine is up and working. Our diver has advised me that he is removing 3-4 times the plants now. I also want to thank the volunteers that have offered to help fight this infestation.

Long Beach marina has been targeted as one of four locations in Sebago for a new DEP grant to have other DASH teams come in and remove milfoil.

Fireworks Are Illegal On Frye Island

In 2011 the legislature voted to legalize fireworks in the State of Maine, the Governor signed the bill making it law. I'm still trying to wrap my head around this one. Fact; the most heavily forested state in the country, which is largely protected by volunteer fire departments now has to worry about people blowing things up in the often dry Maine woods.

During the October, 2011 Town Meeting, the Town voted to adopt a Town Ordinance making the use of fireworks illegal within the Town. This was done for several reasons, mainly to reduce the risk of personal injury, protecting the community of Frye Island from excessive fire danger, and the inconsiderate noise that not many people enjoy. Problem area in the past have been the Beach 3 & 5 areas, Long Beach and the area of the ballfield. Just a heads up, if anyone is caught illegally blowing off fireworks, they will be charged with a violation of the Towns fireworks ordinance. There will be no warning.



Free Blood Pressure Check, First Aid

As high season gets closer the Towns EMS service will be offering courtesy blood pressure checks. This service will be offered Monday through Friday 10:00am to Noon at the Ferry Landing Rescue Barn next to the Post Office. Please stop by and say hi to the EMTs that will be working on the island this summer.

Also offered at no charge will be routine first aid. So for anyone that has an injury that needs attention, stop by the Rescue Barn and have the on duty EMT take a look at your situation, or **call 893-2810** for non-emergency, **911 for emergency** and we'll come to you. As always, all patient care offered by Frye Island

EMS will be at no charge, you will not get a bill. This is a service we are happy to offer to all islanders and visitors.

Free Boater Safety Course

Frye Island PD has schedule a boater safety course through the Maine Warden Service for Saturday, July 11th from 8:00am to 2:00pm. This course will cover all mandatory instruction for minors wishing to operate a watercraft as



well as routine safety tips for all ages. The course will be held at the Fire Department and has a maximum attendance of 20 students. Please sign up at the Town Hall office.




