Island Manager's Comments

The first negotiations meeting will be 8/4/15. Twenty invited local legislature members, one member of the school board for each of the five towns, the superintendent, business manager, one select person from each town, and two citizens from each community are meeting to discuss the needed relief for our Island. Our group will consist of Celeste Beaulieu, Betsy Gleysteen, Gary Donohue, and Daniel Walker from Preti/Flaherty. The entire school district realizes from the last 6 months in Augusta, that school tax relief is needed for Frye Island. I will do my utmost to promote this forward for the Island residents. We as Islanders must realize that the past methods used for tax relief were not handled in the best protocol. I have gained the trust and confidence of many local legislators and other high members in Augusta to help with this problem. Let us be positive in our thinking and work for a better position for our community of 524 homes.

Variable Milfoil

Our new DASH machine and our diver Larry Pilote, and his group of volunteers are doing an outstanding job of cleaning the Long Beach Marina. I have a meeting next week with Roberta Hill from LEA (Lakes Environmental Association) to survey our sites for more help in ridding Frye Island from this invasive plant. There is a grant from the DEP to help offset the costs and bring in more divers and DASH machines to help.

As boaters on Sebago Lake, you should all be careful travelling in rivers, tributaries, and other marinas, not to bring milfoil back on your props to the Island. I have offered to help the LEA as a Town Manager to make the entire Lakes Region aware of the need to combat this problem. Let us all do our part to consider where we travel, as the Lake has problem spots where Milfoil is hardy.

Volunteers in helping with eradication of milfoil are greatly needed. Most of the work would be done on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Time frame 9:30am - 2:00pm. Assisting diver in bagging, walking shoreline and picking up loose fragments. If you have a kayak available, gathering of floating fragments is needed. A new registration can take more than an hour and you may be asked to leave copies of your documents for the registration to be completed and picked up later in the day or another day.

To pay the toll on the ferry you need an E-Z Ride card, a paper ticket, an emailed ticket, or a picture of the E-Z ride card. The ferry employees are not responsible to type in numbers or take verbal requests to use another party's card for passage in any situation. Please provide family, guests, and any vendors you have with one of the above tools for ferry passage.

NIXLE

Our NIXLE system is up and running. This system will notify all subscribers of important / emergency notices in their selected areas via text, web, and email. The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. However, in order to access the notices you will be required to subscribe. You can subscribe by going to their website at www.nixle.com and following the prompts. I would encourage everyone to subscribe to this service. It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island

New Signs (E911 numbers)

The DPW is presently installing the new numbers on Town property. Please do not move these signs after the installation. The signs are the property of the Town of Frye Island. These new NG 911 signs are standardized and placed a certain way at a designated height for a reason. Even though a sign has been installed, there may be some changes to your number as numbering issues get resolved.

Package delivery protocol

All packages delivered by any courier service (UPS, FEDEX, etc.) will be delivered to the Post Office by 7 am the following day. You are responsible to track your own deliveries. If you have a package that is perishable, medicine, overnight delivery you have the right to free pedestrian passage to collect your package at the Ferry trailer once you track and it states delivered.

Fireworks Are Illegal On Frye Island

In 2011 the legislature voted to legalize fireworks in the State of Maine, the Governor signed the bill making it law. I'm still trying to wrap my head around this one. Fact; the most heavily forested state in the country, which is largely protected by volunteer fire departments now has to worry about people blowing things up in the often dry Maine woods.

During the October, 2011 Town Meeting, the Town voted to adopt a Town Ordinance making the use of fireworks illegal within the Town. This was done for several reasons, mainly to reduce the risk of personal injury, protecting the community of Frye Island from excessive fire danger, and the inconsiderate noise that not many people enjoy. Problem area in the past have been the Beach 3 & 5 areas, Long Beach and the area of the ballfield. Just a heads up, if anyone is caught illegally blowing off fireworks, they will be charged with a violation of the Towns fireworks ordinance. There will be no warning.


