Island Manager's Comments

Invasive Aquatic Plant Management.

On May 15th, I attended a meeting at the Lakes Environmental Association to become knowledgeable about the milfoil problems in the Lakes region. I was then asked to help organize all interested parties and surrounding Town Managers to get involved in a strategy to resolve this invasive problem.

Tuesday, July 21st, Roberta Hill, Project Manager for Maine Volunteer Lake Monitoring Program, came to Frye Island to survey the three sites that are infested with milfoil. After the survey, Roberta felt that our sites could be completely cleaned under the new DEP grant for 2015.

Wednesday, July 22nd, I attended a meeting with surrounding Town Managers, Sebago Lake Action Cooperative, and the MVLMP. It was decided at the meeting that Frye Island will be one of the sites to be cleaned of milfoil in three major locations. Long Beach marina, Quail Circle marina, and the Channel at the turn of Leisure Lane heading Southwest. There will be a need for volunteers. I will update you as information of dates becomes available.

Ferry Service FYI

The Leisure Lady has been having serious engine problems. The Ferry service has spent many long hours trying to keep the ferry operational. It was decided for the time being to shuttle unless the lines become long.

There have been busy periods where only one ferry is operational. Please be patient, the ferry service received authority at last Friday's BOS/EXCOM meeting to move forward and purchase new engines for the Leisure Lady. The entire Ferry service has been trying to make this as painless as possible. I personally want to thank the ferry service for a job well done.

Dogs at large

The State of Maine has a leash law that states all dogs must be leashed or under voice command by the owner. The law

is easy to understand and stated in a straight forward manner. However, the language “under voice command” is often abused. If you let your dog out of the house and you are not with it, it’s not under voice command. If you are home and the dog is hanging around the yard and you’re in the house, it’s not under voice command. If you’re at a public beach and the dog is running and jumping on other beach users, it’s not under voice command. The one thing I have learned in over 35 years of public service is that fear is a very real emotion. We are not all afraid of the same things. Some people are afraid of heights, spiders, water, flying, public speaking, snakes, enclosed spaces and the IRS. These fears are very real and adversely affect ones quality of life and enjoyment of the island. I ask all dog owners to consider this when taking your dogs out of the house.

As high season gets closer the Towns EMS service will be offering courtesy blood pressure checks.


This service will be offered Monday through Friday 10:00am to Noon at the Ferry Landing Rescue Barn next to the Post Office. Please stop by and say hi to the EMTs that will be working on the island this summer. Also offered at no charge will be routine first aid. So for anyone that has an injury that needs attention, stop by the Rescue Barn and have the on duty EMT take a look at your situation, or **call 893-2810** for non-emergency, **911 for emergency** and we’ll come to you. As always, all patient care offered by Frye Island EMS will be at no charge, you will not get a bill. This is a service we are happy to offer to all islanders and visitors.

The Town of Frye Island does not allow outside fires of any kind except by permit only. By long standing tradition, however, the Town has allowed outside fires “for warming and cooking” in an approved device such as a chimenea or other screened enclosure without obtaining a permit. Bonfires and campfires on beaches are strictly prohibited. As of June 1st, we have had some rain and the fire danger has dropped somewhat. Outside fires as described above will be allowed for the time being. Please check the FINS weekly or the FI Facebook page for updates. Please exercise extreme care with any outside fire. Thank you.


