Island Manager's Comments

Thirty Day Notices!!!

The notices for not paying your property taxes will be mailed to delinquent tax payers on August 25, 2015. Please, if possible remit your taxes before these notices are mailed to you certified. The added costs will be placed on your accounts.

SAD#6

I have been advised by our hard working school representative, Mrs. Betsy Gleysteen, that the school board has agreed to form a committee under the leadership of their Budget Advisory Committee to begin talks to negotiate with Frye Island on school tax relief. The SAD must report back to the Education and Cultural Affairs Committee prior to the return of the Legislative session in January of 2016 with their recommendations. It is important to remember that the above committee voted unanimously that the SAD needed to negotiate a fairer and more equitable school tax for Frye Island.

I am also waiting for a date to meet with all the Senators and Legislators within the SAD to discuss a strategy for relief and also a futuristic approach for school taxes. July and August are difficult months for meetings due to vacation schedules. I am making every effort to get this work done prior to the close of the Island in November. I will keep you posted of our progress.

Sebago Lake Milfoil Action Committee needs Volunteers

Starting on Monday, August 17th, the Lake Environmental Association has scheduled to work for 3-4 days removing all the milfoil on Frye Island. We will need volunteers each day to dump bags in our

town truck, skim, and kayak to pick up fragments. Warning to all boaters at both Quail and Long Beach marinas, please be aware that there will be divers in the water!!! It is unnecessary to remove your boats from their respective slips, just be cautious when entering or leaving the marinas.

We have had a great season of volunteers helping with this project. Please bring rakes, kayaks, and strong backs to help remove the plants. The more help the divers have, the more milfoil can be removed. This is a great opportunity for our marinas and swamps.

This project will begin at the Quail Circle Marina, then move to the V in the road at Leisure Lane and Hemlock (formerly Birch) then to Long Beach to complete the project.

Frye Island received a unanimous vote from the committee to be the first project on Sebago Lake under the grant from the DEP.

The DPW will provide transport of the milfoil, once extracted and bagged.

Let's all help out.

Our Diver Larry Pilotte and an experienced diver from LEA will also help with the inspections.

Thank you to DownEast Energy, owner Vincent Osterman, donated a \$2,500 propane detector sensor TIF to the Frye Island Fire Department.

Protecting Your Property Value: The Fight Against Milfoil

One of the main reasons that people love to come to Frye Island is the wonderful water that surrounds us. We can walk on the sandy bottom without the squishy mud, algae, and plants that infect so many lakes. However, this, along with our property values, are threatened due to invasive aquatic plants. On Thursday, August 20, Roberta Hill, the marine biologist who surveyed our waters and Larry Pilotte, the diver who has been working diligently to clean out the milfoil, will present a program about these plants, what we can do to rid our waters of them and what we can do to prevent future infestations. Every islander should make an effort to attend this informative program.

As an added benefit, the program will be preceded by a Frye Island tradition – a potluck dinner. A sign-up sheet will be posted in the office. Each family will be asked to bring a casserole, salad, or dessert to serve eight. Water, lemonade, and coffee will be provided.

We understand that weekenders will not be able to avail themselves of this opportunity but the speakers were able to come only during the week.

If you are unable to come to the potluck dinner, you may still attend the program.

The Frye Island Yacht Club Annual Meeting and Election of Marina Committee members will be held Labor Day Weekend at the Community Center. Day and Time TBA.



Dogs at Large

The State of Maine has a leash law that states all dogs must be leashed or under voice command by the owner. The law is easy to understand and stated in a straight forward manner. However, the language “under voice command” is often abused. If you let your dog out of the house and you are not with it, it’s not under voice command. If you are home and the dog is hanging around the yard and you’re in the house, it’s not under voice command. If you’re at a public beach and the dog is running and jumping on other beach users, it’s not under voice command.

The one thing I have learned in over 35 years of public service is that fear is a very real emotion. We are not all afraid of the same things. Some people are afraid of heights, spiders, water, flying, public speaking, snakes, enclosed spaces and the IRS. These fears are very real and adversely affect ones quality of life and enjoyment of the island. I ask all dog owners to consider this when taking your dogs out of the house.

Free Blood Pressure Check, First Aid



Frye Island EMS offers courtesy blood pressure checks during the high season to any one that would like to stop by. This service will be offered Monday through Friday from 10:00am to Noon at the Ferry landing next to the Post Office. Often the on duty EMT can be found within a short distance from the rescue, usually chatting with islanders in the area of the store or near the dock. The EMT will be in uniform just like the one in this photo so they can be easily identified. Please stop by and say hi to the EMT, they will be happy to take your blood pressure or assist you in any other way.

Also offered at no charge, will be routine first aid. So for anyone that has an injury that needs attention, stop by the Rescue Barn and have the on duty EMT take a look at your situation, or **call 893-2810** for non-emergency, **911 for emergency** and we’ll come to you. As always, all patient care offered by Frye Island EMS will be at no charge, you will not get a bill. This is a service we are happy to offer to all islanders and visitors.

Please learn your NG 911 Address

I ask everyone to please learn your new NG 911 address. A number of times this season, Public Safety have been dispatched to routine and emergency call for service, only to find that the address given was a lot number, not the NG 911 address. This will pose a serious problem when a life threatening emergency exists. The ability to quickly find your home while responding to a serious medical call is of the utmost importance and could drastically affect the outcome of your situation. So I ask again, please learn your lot number, post it in a readily accessible location and use it when calling for Public Safety services.




