Ferry Card replacements

Effective last Friday night, the Executive Committee voted to charge \$10.00 per replacement card. This season the administration has produced over 250 replacement cards during this season to date. If the cards have some value we are hoping that people will be more careful with them.

Squatters in the Marina

We discovered this week because of the DASH boat being issued slip# 98 for dockage, that people are using town owned marina slips without authorization or payment. This practice will not be tolerated. I have instructed Public Safety to provide me with a plan of enforcement. Either rent a slip or remove your watercraft from the Long Beach Marina.

Past Frye Island Representative to the SAD6 School Board

Oleg Svetlichny, 86, slipped away from this world peacefully, surrounded by family, in the early morning of Tuesday, July 28, 2015.

"Served my new country with gratitude, pride, and honor." That is what "Papa," as he was known to his children, wanted on his grave marker. As a Russian immigrant with a last name they couldn't spell or pronounce, his fellow soldiers called him Smitty. An aircraft mechanic in the US Air Force, his name was displayed on the aircraft under his care. His interest in aviation led to a Master of Science in Aeronautical Engineering from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, and an MBA. His career included working at MIT, and for the Department of Defense in The Netherlands.

His lung cancer was suspect as mesothelioma (always from asbestos exposure), which then spread to his brain. Accepting his fate, Oleg lived his last months with courage and humor.

Oleg was born on November 28, 1928, in Kharkov, Ukraine, and grew up in Graivoron, USSR (now Russia). He was the third of four children born to Mikhail Svetlichny and Anna Svetlichny. The family fled the USSR during the war, first living at a displaced persons camp in Germany, and arriving in the USA in 1949.

Oleg loved nature. In 1966, he with his wife Natalie bought a plot of land on Frye Island, Maine. They were among the first four families on the island. Oleg built the cottage, a Dacha as it is known in Russian, along with his father, a carpenter by trade. It was the

summer childhood home of his children, and a cherished gathering place for family and friends.

Oleg's parents and his brother Boris Mikhailovich Svetlichny predeceased him. He is survived by brothers Vadim Svetlichny and George Svetlichny; life partner Jacqueline "Jackie" Ellis; son Boris Svetlichny (Sigrid); daughter Miranda Luda Svetlichny Davies (Steven); daughter Lana Svetlichny; grandchildren Katherine Svetlichny, Erik Svetlichny, and Joshua Davies.

Oleg instilled in his children the importance of higher education, and an interest in photography, travel, and water sports to include scuba diving.

Oleg enjoyed cooking, reading, creating his life story on his computer, and spending time with the love of his life, Jackie Ellis. His telephone conversations with his children always ended with the words "lots of love."

Oleg placed a high value on education, and was a board member of Maine School Administrative District #6 for many years.

Oleg loved his cats and all animals. He was a volunteer for years at the Animal Refuge League of Greater Portland.

In lieu of flowers, the family requests that you support Oleg's love of animals with donations in his memory to the [Animal Refuge League of Greater Portland](#). He was laid to rest with military honors in Southern Maine Veterans Cemetery.

Personally, I know when I do my distance running on even days of the week and my speed work on odd days of the week I find this suggestion not only creates a safer situation for all, but also enhances my workout regimen.



Free Blood Pressure Check, First Aid



Frye Island EMS offers courtesy blood pressure checks during the high season to any one that would like to stop by. This service will be offered Monday through Friday from 10:00am to Noon at the Ferry landing next to the Post Office. Often the on duty EMT can be found within a short distance from the rescue, usually chatting with islanders in the area of the store or near the dock. The EMT will be in uniform just like the one in this photo so they can be easily identified. Please stop by and say hi to the EMT, they will be happy to take your blood pressure or assist you in any other way.

Also offered at no charge, will be routine first aid. So for anyone that has an injury that needs attention,

stop by the Rescue Barn and have the on duty EMT take a look at your situation, or **call 893-2810** for non-emergency, **911 for emergency** and we'll come to you. As always, all patient care offered by Frye Island EMS will be at no charge, you will not get a bill. This is a service we are happy to offer to all islanders and visitors.

Please learn your NG 911 Address

I ask everyone to please learn your new NG 911 address. A number of times this season, Public Safety have been dispatched to routine and emergency call for service, only to find that the address given was a lot number, not the NG 911 address. This will pose a serious problem when a life threatening emergency exists. The ability to quickly find your home while responding to a serious medical call is of the utmost importance and could drastically affect the outcome of your situation. So I ask again, please learn your lot number, post it in a readily accessible location and use it when calling for Public Safety services.




