Island Manager's Comments

Tax Liens-

30 Day Notices were sent August 25, 2015. Many bills remain unpaid. Tax liens will be filed after September 25th. Please mail payments promptly.

The Budget Advisory Committee of the school district has scheduled a meeting on October 1, 2015 with Frye Island on school tax relief. The Select people, Town Manager, school board rep, and our legal team will represent our community in the much needed negotiations. Over the next few weeks the group will meet with our attorneys to discuss all options available to Frye Island and develop the most logical strategy to keep this island sustainable.

Litter

I was out walking on Sunday, and I was extremely disturbed to see so much litter on both sides of the roads. In my 17 seasons as an owner on this Island I have never seen it this bad. We all need to step up and eliminate this from our little Island.

Ferry Card replacements

Effective last Friday night, the Executive Committee voted to charge \$10.00 per replacement card. This season the administration has produced over 250 replacement cards during this season to date. If the cards have some value we are hoping that people will be more careful with them.

Squatters in the Marina

We discovered this week because of the DASH boat being issued slip# 98 for dockage, that people are using town owned marina slips without authorization or payment. This practice will not be tolerated. I have instructed Public Safety to provide me with a plan of enforcement. Either rent a slip or remove your watercraft from the Long Beach Marina.

Beginning Monday, September 7, 2015, the on duty EMT will be going house to house in a chronological order dropping off “Public Safety” refrigerator magnets. These magnets will have emergency and business contact numbers as well as your NG 911 address and closest landmark written boldly on the magnet. These magnets will assist the caller in an emergency situation and communicate a more accurate location of the emergency. The magnets will be dropped off at your home in an easy to find location. This project should take approximately one month to complete.


