Manager's Comments **"Island Dust"**

The Administration and DPW are both sensitive to your concerns about the dust on the roads. If you apply the calcium on a dry surface its effect is short lived. Wednesday afternoon we had rain showers that allowed the DPW to treat the road on Wednesday night (6/22). When the conditions are dry, everyone can help lower the dust by reducing their driving speed to 15 mph. So I ask all our residents, town employees, and guests to please be sensitive to those who reside in dusty areas and drive slower than the speed limit.

Dry Conditions:

The Island is marked for Extreme Fire condition. Please be very careful with your cooking fires. Please do not use your outdoor screened enclosure fire pits or chimeneas under these conditions.

Office Hours

The Administration office will be closed July 2, 2016. Please plan around this date.

Town office hours

The office will be open Tuesday thru Saturday from 9am to 3pm. Please take advantage of the available on-line services to help keep the line short in the office during high season.

If you have a brand new registration for a boat, car, golf cart or trailer, please try to come during the week when the office is not as busy. Call ahead to be sure you have all the proper documents and discuss with the office staff the possibility of an appointment time to complete the new registrations. A new registration can take more than an hour and you may be asked to leave copies of your documents for the registration to be completed and picked up later in the day or another day.

MSAD#6

Our meeting with the school board has been delayed until July 25th at 6pm. MSAD#6 has had other issues with the resignation of the Superintendent. I have advised Representative Austin of the delay. It is very frustrating with all the waiting.

2nd Half Property Taxes due 6/30/2016

Your second payment on your property taxes are due by June 30, 2016. Your second payment remittance stub is attached to your bills that were mailed in November of 2015. This is just a reminder for you that taxes are due shortly. There is only one bill mailed per year.

Property Tax Procedure

The Town of Frye Island mails out your annual property tax bills the first week of November. At the bottom of each bill there are two remittance coupons. The first payment is due by December 31st of the year mailed. The second remittance is due by June 30th of the following year. If you have an unpaid balance after June 30th a certified letter is mailed to your address on file as a 30 day notice. After the lapse of an additional 30 days the liens are attached to the property in arrears. After 17 months the property owner will receive another notification warning of foreclosure. 30 days later the subject property will be foreclosed.

Fireworks Contributions

Removal of Boats Saturday, July 2 for Fireworks

The fireworks will be off Long Beach on Saturday night the 2nd at dusk. (8:45-9:15pm)

Reminder: if you have a boat in the Long Beach Marina in slip # 84 through #130 on the lake side or #67 through #131 on the causeway side, your boat **MUST BE MOVED** by 5PM to allow the pyro technicians the time to set up the display safely. Even if you don't have to move your boat and you are planning on viewing the fireworks from the lake, you must be out of the marina by 5 PM as well. The marina will reopen immediately following the fireworks display. In the event that poor weather postpones the event as it did last year a sign will be placed on the bulletin board.

The Administration has received complaints of loose dogs and loud barking early in the morning. I am listing the dog ordinance for all to review. Please be considerate of your fellow islanders.

Ferry Ride Requirements

To pay the toll on the ferry you need an E-Z Ride card, a paper ticket, an emailed ticket, or a picture of the E-Z ride card. The ferry employees are not responsible to type in numbers or take verbal requests to use another party's card for passage in any situation. Please provide family, guests, and any vendors you have with one of the above tools for ferry passage.

NIXLE

Our NIXLE system is up and running. This system will notify all subscribers of important / emergency notices in their selected areas via text, web, and email. The best part of this is that it is a free service to both the municipality and to residents as well. We can initiate notices to all Islanders that subscribe to the service. However, in order to access the notices you will be required to subscribe. You can subscribe by going to their website at www.nixle.com and following the prompts. I would encourage everyone to subscribe to this service. It is an ideal way to be notified of issues that may affect your time on the Island.

Small Package Delivery (up to 70 lbs.)

All packages delivered by any courier service (UPS, FEDEX, etc.) will be delivered to the Post Office by 7 am the following day. You are responsible to Track your own deliveries. If you have a package that is perishable, medicine, or overnight delivery you have the right to free pedestrian passage to collect your package at the Ferry trailer once you track and it states delivered.

Large Package Protocol (over 70 lbs.)

Bob Sutherland has volunteered for the past seven seasons to bring all the UPS and FedEx packages across to the Post Office in his own vehicle. I want to thank Bob for his effort. E-commerce has changed the way we shop. FedEx and UPS now handle larger packages. Packages over 70 lbs. are labeled "heavy", "dangerous" or request "team space lift". Bob works alone.

Our volunteer has handled all packages including the occasional heavy packages in the past. The increase number of large packages' makes it necessary to modify our procedure's effective June 1, 2016.

Recipients must track large packages and confirm delivery to the Ferry trailer in Raymond. When package arrival is confirmed, the recipient must contact the ferry trailer to schedule free round trip ferry vehicle transit to pick up the package.

The recipient is now responsible for the handling of heavy items from the Ferry trailer to their cottage.

Requirements for New Registrations of Cars, Golf Carts, UTVs, Trailers & Boats

If you have a new Registration, please call ahead to arrange a good time to come in.

In order to expedite the process, the following is required:

Bill of Sale, including VIN #, and Sales Tax, Paid/Unpaid, Purchase Date, Year of Vehicle/Boat, Seller Information (Name and Address)

Insurance Card (including VIN # and Expiration Date)

Driver’s License (need to see names as shown on license) and Birthdates

Mailing Address and Frye Island Address

Contact Phone # (prefer cell)

Who the Vehicle/Boat was Purchased From (Name and Address)

Trailer # of Tires, # of Axles, Color, Type of Trailer (boat, utility, camper)

Golf Cart Make, Color, Gas/Electric, proof of insurance with VIN and expiration date on policy card

Vehicle Make, Color, Mileage, Title Application if already completed, Previous Title if changing States, window sticker if new vehicle, Lease Agreement if Leased, Proof of Insurance

Boats Color, HP, Open/Close Bow, Salt/Fresh Water, Fiberglass/Metal, Length, Previous Registration Number if in Maine, Fuel Type, Inboard, Outboard, or In/Out

E911 Addresses/Mailing Addresses

Please take note of your E911 address in case of emergency and provide this number when you call. There should be a blue sign on the front of your property. The Frye Island Police distributed magnets last year for your refrigerator with your E911 address. If there is a discrepancy please notify the office.

There is a list on the website of the E911 addresses. Go to the “Find Information” tab (top right), click “topic index”, under the letter “E”, click on “Emergency Contact information”.

For mailing address purposes, the post office still uses your original lot number. The United States Postal Service has not provided a new zip code to Frye Island so the mailing address will continue to be your original Lot number and street name.

FairPoint is using the E911 addresses to locate the properties. When you call to set up your service you will need to provide your E911 address. However, please give them your mailing address separately. If you receive your mail on Frye Island it is your Lot number and street name.

Central Maine Power is set up based on the original Lot numbers if you already have a house on your property. They are requesting you to call them at 800 750-4000 ext.5 to give them your E911 address to locate your property and add this to your account. Your mailing address should still be the Lot number or the off island mailing address. To set up new service they will locate your property using the Lot number on your deed. Once an E911 address is assigned to your new house they would like to put this on your account.

Island Residents Input Needed!

The Long Beach Marina and Quail Circle are full this year other than 2 general slips with weekly rentals at Long Beach. Please be sure to put your Marina Sticker on your boat. We will be towing squatters. If you rent out your slip, whether yearly or temporarily, please notify the Town Office with a letter stating the person renting, a phone number for them and your slip #. Your renter will need a Marina Sticker also.

Waterline work has started on Fairway Lane, please travel carefully as our equipment will be moving in this area and golf cart traffic is high. As golf carts are low, please be sure that the Trench Monkeys see you before you pass.

Dust: I will try here to dispel some of the rumors about the dusty roads. As you all have seen, we are in an extremely dry spell and the road dust is severe. As soon as we get some substantial rain and the roads are damp, we have 2000 gallons of liquid calcium to spray on the roads. If we put the calcium down on a dry road bed, it just beads up and hardly works or lasts, effectively wasting \$2,500. If it is put on a damp road it can keep dust down for up to three weeks.

Rumor; DPW is not spraying the roads because of budget cuts: As a result of last year's Town Meeting rejecting the 2016 budget the DPW has been told to cut this year's budget by \$26,000, so yes we are tightening our belts and are trying to save funds from all of our budget line items, and yes calcium chloride is a budget line item. But the only reason that the calcium has not been sprayed as of yet are is the dry conditions in June.

Rumor; if you slow down to 15 MPH or slower dust created by your vehicle is lessened? **THIS IS TRUE!**

Rumor; if you leave the trees along the road to shade the street the roads are less dusty? **TRUE**, take a ride down the north end of Leisure Lane, where the trees are almost a canopy over the road, much less dust! Property owners have no right to cut down trees along the road if they are in the Town right of way. The right of way is the property from your lot pins to the road, and you need Town permission to cut any trees in this right of way.

DPW quote of the week,

Let's get this straight; it's called a "dirt road." I drive a pickup truck because I want to. No matter how slow you drive, you're going to get dust on your Lexus. Drive it or get out of the way.



8th Tee Construction:

Construction has begun for the new tee boxes for the 8th hole. Due to the generosity of one of our members along with funds supplemented by the golf club, we are undertaking to revise the 8th tee with a significantly expanded tee area which will incorporate all 4 color tee markers in a single continuous tee box. This new tee box will eliminate the uneven tee areas we previously had while allowing us to more efficiently maintain all of the tees in a uniform manner. We have designed the new tee to allow for similar yardages to what we previously had while adding in new tee areas permitting us to rotate the tees which allows for frequently used areas to recover faster. While we understand the construction of the new tee does temporarily take away from the beauty of this hole, the long term positive impact of the new tee will benefit us all. While the new tee is under construction and in the subsequent growth stage, we apologize for the inconvenience of utilizing the temporary teeing areas. We will have the new tee in place as soon as it is healthy enough to sustain play.
