## Pest Alert



The State of Maine Forest Entomologist visited the island last Thursday. Hemlock Woolly Adelgid has been found in several areas of the island, this is a very serious issue that can decimate the hemlock trees on the island. Also found is Elongate Hemlock Scale, which is extremely rare in Maine. The Forest Service will be coming back out to map the areas and advise a course of treatment. In the meantime the Public Works Department will not be selling any mulch at this time, we will also be quarantining any hemlock tree brush that comes into the Transfer Station. We are asking all residents and contractors to separate hemlock from other brush and we will have a specific area in the Transfer Station for only hemlock. Deb Edwards will have a few handouts for those who want them with more on the way from the State.

We are in the research stage with State and Federal agencies responsible for these types of problems and will provide more information as it becomes available.

## Manager's Comments

### Budget for 2016

The budget hearing is this Saturday, July 16th at 8:30 am at the New Town Hall. We have spent considerable time working on this. Our goal was to maintain the same tax rate as we billed last November. By keeping the tax rate the same the town will not be burdened with having the additional cost of doing a mailing of additional tax bills or checks.

### MSAD#6

I was advised Tuesday by Jim Moses our School Board Representative that the MSAD#6 school board voted to begin the process of Statute 1301. Finances. I will include the language of the statute after my explanation. In October of 2014 when we first pursued relief for our school tax burden with MSAD#6, I was advised that they would never vote to open the 1301 process. Monday night's decision to begin the process is truly great progress. The MSAD#6 board realizes that Frye Island cannot go on at this rate. The 1301 process is explained in the statute, but I will further explain our problem and what we are trying to achieve.

The growth of Frye Island has been slowing down for the last number of years. I will not speculate to know exactly why, but I believe that our high property taxes is a major contributor.

Frye Island's value from 2015 to 2016 has grown by only \$500,000.00 of new value. If you take  $500 \times 22.84$  (tax rate) = 11,420.00 of new growth for an entire year. That means the school increase of 51,877.63 requires the taxpayers to

contribute an additional 40,457.63 just for school tax. All other increases in non-municipal and municipal costs are also new additions to the tax rate. In simple terms every time the cost of operations for the Town increases by approximately 100,000.00 your mil-rate increases by 1.00 (one dollar).

The Town has only three sources of revenue. Maine revenue sharing which is less than 300.00 per annum, total non-tax revenue which is estimated at 181,731.00, and 2,669,849 to be raised by property tax.

In 2016, the Code Enforcement officer issued 3 permits for new construction. If this new value reaches 500,000, you will have an increase in revenue about the same as 2016.

Our community is shortly on the verge of becoming non sustainable. I have realized this since my time serving as a member of the Executive Committee.

We are looking forward to working with MSAD#6 on the 1301, but we are also looking at other directions for a viable solution for our problem. The Governor, Dept. of Education, and the legislature are watching this very closely and I hope that MSAD#6 takes our position seriously.

The best solution for our Island and MSAD#6 is to change the funding formula to 50% property value and 50% student population. Under this formula both Frye Island and the Town of Standish see reductions in school obligations.

Unfortunately the other three communities would have increases, but that would be because they have higher student populations. Another option is to buy our way out MSAD#6. Any formula or buy outs can be offered as methods of sharing costs under 1301. It would be to the entire MSAD#6 best interest to try to compromise a solution.

In Maine only two school districts use property value to access school tax, the balance of the state works off student population. The two school districts that work off property values are MSAD#6 which includes Frye Island and MSAD#44 which includes the Sunday River ski towns which have very small student populations.

I have attached the statutes below for you all to read.

**Maine Revised Statutes  
Title 20-A: EDUCATION**

**Chapter 103: SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICTS**

**§1301. FINANCES**

A school administrative district may raise money for establishing and maintaining public schools, erecting buildings and providing equipment. [1981, c. 693, §§5, 8 (NEW).]

**1. Methods of sharing costs.** The costs of operating a school administrative district must be shared among all municipalities within the district in one of the following ways.

A. Under a property valuation method, municipalities in a district shall share costs in the same proportion as each municipality's fiscal capacity as defined in section 15672, subsection 23 is to the district's fiscal capacity. [2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §3 (AMD); 2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §§72, 74 (AFF); 2005, c. 12, Pt. WW, §18 (AFF).]

B. Under an alternate plan approved by the state board and by a vote of the legislative bodies of the school administrative units forming the district and based on:

(1) The number of resident pupils in each town;

(2) The fiscal capacity of each member municipality as defined in section 15672, subsection 23;

(3) Any combination of subparagraphs (1) and (2); or

(4) Any other factor or combination of factors that may, but need not, include subparagraphs (1) and (2). [2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §4 (AMD); 2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §§72, 74 (AFF); 2005, c. 12, Pt. WW, §18 (AFF).]

C. [2001, c. 375, §1 (RP).]

D. Notwithstanding paragraphs A and B, Title 30-A, chapter 208-A or any other provision of law, the state valuation used to calculate the shared cost for each municipality in a district with a municipal incentive development zone must include the increase in equalized just value of all industrial and commercial property located in the zone over the assessed value. [1993, c. 696, §1 (NEW).]

[ 2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §§3, 4 (AMD); 2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §§72, 74 (AFF); 2005, c. 12, Pt. WW, §18 (AFF) .]

**2. Residents on federal property or state property.** For the purposes of this chapter only, a district shall count students residing on land under the control of the Federal Government, on a federal military reservation, or on state property, as residents of the district but not as residents of a municipality.

[ 1985, c. 15, (AMD) .]

**3. Amendment of cost-sharing formulas.** The cost-sharing formula may be amended as follows.

A. If requested by a written petition of at least 10% of the number of voters voting in the last gubernatorial election within the district, or if approved by a majority of the full board of directors, the board of directors shall hold at least one meeting of municipal representatives to reconsider the method of sharing costs. The district shall give at least 15 days' notice to each municipality comprising the district of any meeting. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

B. Each member municipality must be represented at the meeting or meetings by 2 representatives chosen at large by its municipal officers, and one member of the district board of directors chosen by the municipality's directors. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

B-1. Prior to the first meeting of municipal representatives pursuant to paragraph A, the district shall engage the services of a facilitator selected from the list maintained by the commissioner under subsection 4, paragraph C, subparagraph 1. The facilitator shall:

(1) At the first meeting, review and present data and information pertaining to sharing of costs within the district. Pertinent information may include, but is not limited to, the following:

(a) A description of the district's cost-sharing method, the elements involved in the calculation of each municipality's costs and a graphic depiction of the current and historic distribution of costs in the district; and

(b) If withdrawal of one or more district members is under consideration, the financial and educational impact of the withdrawal;

(2) Solicit and prepare a balanced summary of the concerns of municipal officials, educators and the public about the current method of cost sharing; and

(3) Develop a plan of action for consideration by the municipal representatives that responds to the information collected and the concerns raised. The plan of action must include a list of expectations for the conduct of the parties, options for proceeding and an assessment of the likely success of those options. [2001, c. 375, §2 (NEW).]

C. A change in the method of sharing costs may only be approved by a majority vote of the municipal representatives present and voting. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

C-1. If a majority of the representatives from each municipality meeting pursuant to paragraph A are unable to agree on a recommendation on what the cost-sharing method for the district should be, within 15 days following the last meeting a knowledgeable 3rd party must be selected in accordance with rules adopted pursuant to subsection 4, paragraph C. The district is responsible for compensating the 3rd party. The 3rd party shall:

(1) Prepare a written summary of the process to date, including an assessment of the fairness, accuracy and responsiveness of the recommendations of the facilitator engaged pursuant to paragraph B-1;

(2) Prepare an impartial recommendation regarding changing the method of cost sharing; and

(3) Present the summary and recommendations to the municipal representatives for their consideration. [2001, c. 375, §2 (NEW).]

C-2. At an advertised public hearing, the municipal representatives shall solicit public input on the 3rd party's recommendation for cost sharing required under paragraph C-1 and any alternative method or methods proposed by municipal representatives. [2001, c. 375, §2 (NEW).]

D. If a change in the cost-sharing method is approved by a majority of the municipal representatives meeting pursuant to paragraph A, the change must be submitted to the voters at a district meeting. It becomes effective when approved by a majority vote of the district in a district referendum called and held for this purpose in accordance with sections 1351 to 1354, except that, if the proposed change is an alternative cost-sharing plan under subsection 1, paragraph B, subparagraph 4, the change must be approved by a majority of voters voting in a referendum in each municipality in the district instead of in a district referendum. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

E. Assessments made by the school board thereafter must be made in accordance with the new method of sharing costs. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

F. The secretary of the district shall notify the state board that the district has voted to change its method of sharing costs. The state board shall issue an amended certificate of organization showing this new method of sharing costs. [1981, c. 693, §§5, 8 (NEW).]

[ 2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD) .]

**4. Departmental assistance.** The department shall provide the following services relating to changing district cost-sharing methods:

A. The provision of information and data relating to cost sharing, including, but not limited to, a description of a district's method of cost sharing, the total assessment, the per pupil cost and mills raised for education for district members and the calculation of member costs. The information must be district-specific, comprehensive, easily understood by the general public, presented in graphic and spreadsheet format and available over the Internet. Written copies of the information described and additional information requested must be provided by the department upon receipt of a written request from a district school board or the legislative body of any municipality member of a district; [2001, c. 375, §3 (NEW).]

B. The provision of professional evaluation and assistance to districts and member municipalities considering changes in cost-sharing methods; and [2001, c. 375, §3 (NEW).]

C. The establishment and maintenance of lists of qualified, available individuals to assist districts considering changes in cost-sharing methods as follows:

- (1) Facilitators as required in subsection 3, paragraph B-1; and
- (2) Knowledgeable 3rd parties as required in subsection 3, paragraph C-1.

In establishing the lists, the department shall seek input from the Maine Municipal Association and Maine School Management Association or successor organizations. The department may adopt rules to define the qualifications, responsibilities and selection of individuals on the lists. Rules adopted pursuant to this paragraph are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A. [2001, c. 375, §3 (NEW).]

## Department of Public Works

After locating Hilltop Drive on their GPS, the Trench Monkeys are in the process of installing new waterline there. Stumpy has gotten lost three times returning from coffee runs, and the coffees are cold by the time he finally arrives back at the Hilltop job site. So now he is re-heating the coffees in his portable microwave before serving the rest of the crew. Next up Ducks Head Road, Stumpy knows where that road is.

### Transfer Station

At the present time, we are out of mulch to sell, we should have some in about two weeks.

Trash has been thrown over the fence at the Transfer Station, and left at the beach barrels, and of course the birds and animals tear it apart. These trash dumping(s) are violations of State and local law.

The Transfer Station is open three days a week and these slobs cannot wait for the next open day! If you see something, say something!

Also discovered in trash are American flags! REALLY! Several have been removed from trash bags and the demo dumpsters. Please hand your unwanted US flag to the Transfer Attendant. WE TREAT FLAGS WITH RESPECT! A volunteer (John Nun) delivers them to the local American Legion, they in turn dispose of the flags properly with respect, we are sure that the illegal dumpers also trash our flag.

### Woolly Adelgid

Several have asked how we are going to deal with this extensive infestation of the Adelgid. I talked extensively with the State Entomologist and I will try and summarize some of that discussion.

What can we do? Not much, we need to slow the spread, this has been on the island for ten years or more, it is heavily established on the islands north end and to a lesser degree on the south end. One of the major ways of spreading the Adelgid is by vehicle, it is also moved around by birds, animals, wind and people. If you park under an affected tree with your vehicle, or your vehicle brushes up against a branch of an affected tree, you will take the Adelgid with you as you travel around the island or mainland. So prune your hemlocks high so they are above your vehicles, prune them so they don't protrude into your driveway or the road. LEAVE the cut brush on the ground under the effected tree for at least three weeks to a month. Then you can bring it to the Transfer Station where we will again quarantine it for another three weeks before grinding it into mulch. Please DO NOT transport the newly cut hemlock as you will surely spread the Adelgid on your way to the Transfer Station. Three weeks to a month after cutting the brush you can safely transport it. Remember, you need to reduce the spread of the Adelgid by people and vehicles!

Spraying; treating should not be before the fall, it just is not effective until fall. The same goes for injecting into the ground or into the tree, wait till fall. Also these applications would have to be done yearly, these only slow the spread of this pest.

### Beetles

Yes, there is a beetle that is effective against the Adelgid. They cost \$1.50 to \$2.00 each, we would need to purchase about 10,000 of them, and they would likely save trees that are not heavily infested. We are trying to arrange for the State Entomologist to come out in September and give a talk on this subject.

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
