PROCEDURE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

When the need arises for EMS, Emergency Medical Services, please call 911 immediately. Our dispatch center is Cumberland County Regional Dispatch Center located in Windham and the dispatcher, after getting vital information, will contact the EMS crews for both Frye Island and Raymond Rescue to respond via the radio system. The ambulances will respond directly to the scene where needed. Please do not drive the patient to the Fire Barn or the ferry landing as the crews may be on the road doing driver training or at a community event.

To help prevent delays in emergency responses, please call 911 as soon as possible and give your new 911 address number and street name to the dispatcher! Not sure if you really need 911? Call anyway! The EMS crews will respond and help you with the medical situation and direct you to what medical care is needed!

Pest Alert



The State of Maine Forest Entomologist visited the island last Thursday. Hemlock Woolly Adelgid has been found in several areas of the island, this is a very serious issue that can decimate the hemlock trees on the island. Also found is Elongate Hemlock Scale, which is extremely rare in Maine. The Forest Service will be coming back out to map the areas and advise a course of treatment. In the meantime the Public Works Department will not be selling any mulch at this time, we will also be quarantining any hemlock tree brush that comes into the Transfer Station. We are asking all residents and contractors to separate hemlock from other brush and we will have a specific area in the Transfer Station for only hemlock. Deb Edwards will have a few handouts for those who want them with more on the way from the State. We are in the research stage with State and Federal agencies responsible for these types of problems and will provide more information as it becomes available.

SUBJECT: Appointment of Municipal Representatives to Section 1301 Cost Sharing Review Committee

As you are probably aware, the Town of Frye Island has been pursuing a strategy at both the State and local level to try to reduce the property tax burden of the Island's taxpayers. As part of this effort, they have retained a law firm to act as their lobbyist; they have introduced legislation to change the MSAD 6 cost sharing formula and permit the Town to withdraw from MSAD 6; they have tried to enlist the support of the Governor's office; and they are exploring the possibility of de-organizing as a town and becoming a part of the State's unorganized territory. They have also held a recent meeting with the MSAD 6 Board of Directors to try to improve relationships and find common ground.

Believing that this issue can best be addressed at the local level, the Board of Directors of MSAD 6 has voted to initiate a local review of the District's cost sharing formula pursuant to 20-A M.R.S. §1301(3). Under this statute, a copy of which is enclosed, the Board of Directors is required to call a meeting of town representatives to review the District's cost sharing formula. Each member municipality must be represented at the meeting by two representatives chosen at large by the municipal officers and one member of the District Board of Directors chosen by that municipality's directors. Before this initial meeting, the District is required to engage the services of a facilitator selected from a list maintained by the Commissioner of Education. The facilitator is required to review and present data and information relating to the District's method of sharing costs along with historical data, a graphic depiction of the current and historic distribution of costs, and other related materials.

If a majority of the representatives from each municipality on the cost sharing review committee approve an amendment to the District's cost sharing formula, that proposed amendment must then be submitted to the District's voters for approval at a referendum. If a majority of the members of the cost sharing review committee from each municipality are unable to agree on a proposed amendment to the District's cost sharing formula, Section 1301 provides that the District must then retain a knowledgeable third party to submit a report and make an impartial recommendation. If the third party's recommendation is

is approved by a majority of the municipal representatives on the cost sharing review committee, the proposed amendment must be submitted to the voters of the District at referendum. If a majority of the municipal representatives do not approve the third party's recommendation, or if the proposed amendment is defeated by the voters, the District's existing cost sharing formula remains in effect.

The purpose of this memo is to advise you that MSAD 6 will be retaining a facilitator under Section 1301 and that the District will be calling a meeting of municipal representatives to discuss the District's cost sharing formula once the facilitator has submitted the required report. As part of this process, the municipal officers of each town in the District are required to select two representatives at large to represent their municipality on the Section 1301 cost sharing review committee.

As soon as the facilitator has submitted the required report, the District will provide the municipal officers of each of the member towns at least 15 days' notice of the date of the initial meeting of the Section 1301 cost sharing review committee. In the meantime, we respectfully request that the municipal officers of each of the member towns in MSAD 6 select two members at large to represent their town on the Section 1301 cost sharing review committee.

Maine Revised Statutes
Title 20-A: EDUCATION
Chapter 103: SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICTS

§1301. FINANCES

A school administrative district may raise money for establishing and maintaining public schools, erecting buildings and providing equipment. [1981, c. 693, §§5, 8 (NEW).]

1. Methods of sharing costs. The costs of operating a school administrative district must be shared among all municipalities within the district in one of the following ways.

A. Under a property valuation method, municipalities in a district shall share costs in the same proportion as each municipality's fiscal capacity as defined in section 15672, subsection 23 is to the district's fiscal capacity. [2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §3 (AMD); 2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §§72, 74 (AFF); 2005, c. 12, Pt. WW, §18 (AFF).]

B. Under an alternate plan approved by the state board and by a vote of the legislative bodies of the school administrative units forming the district and based on:

- (1) The number of resident pupils in each town;
- (2) The fiscal capacity of each member municipality as defined in section 15672, subsection 23;
- (3) Any combination of subparagraphs (1) and (2); or
- (4) Any other factor or combination of factors that may, but need not, include subparagraphs (1) and (2). [2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §4 (AMD); 2005, c. 2, Pt. D, §§72, 74 (AFF); 2005, c. 12, Pt. WW, §18 (AFF).]

C. [2001, c. 375, §1 (RP).]

D. Notwithstanding paragraphs A and B, Title 30-A, chapter 208-A or any other provision of law, the state valuation used to calculate the shared cost for each municipality in a district with a municipal incentive development zone must include the increase in equalized just value of all industrial and commercial property located in the zone over the assessed value. [1993, c. 696, §1 (NEW).]

2. Residents on federal property or state property. For the purposes of this chapter only, a district shall count students residing on land under the control of the Federal Government, on a federal military reservation, or on state property, as residents of the district but not as residents of a municipality.

[1985, c. 15, (AMD) .]

3. Amendment of cost-sharing formulas. The cost-sharing formula may be amended as follows.

A. If requested by a written petition of at least 10% of the number of voters voting in the last gubernatorial election within the district, or if approved by a majority of the full board of directors, the board of directors shall hold at least one meeting of municipal representatives to reconsider the method of sharing costs. The district shall give at least 15 days' notice to each municipality comprising the district of any meeting. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

B. Each member municipality must be represented at the meeting or meetings by 2 representatives chosen at large by its municipal officers, and one member of the district board of directors chosen by the municipality's directors. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

B-1. Prior to the first meeting of municipal representatives pursuant to paragraph A, the district shall engage the services of a facilitator selected from the list maintained by the commissioner under subsection 4, paragraph C, subparagraph 1. The facilitator shall:

- (1) At the first meeting, review and present data and information pertaining to sharing of costs within the district. Pertinent information may include, but is not limited to, the following:
 - (a) A description of the district's cost-sharing method, the elements involved in the calculation of each municipality's costs and a graphic depiction of the current and historic distribution of costs in the district; and
 - (b) If withdrawal of one or more district members is under consideration, the financial and educational impact of the withdrawal;
- (2) Solicit and prepare a balanced summary of the concerns of municipal officials, educators and the public about the current method of cost sharing; and
- (3) Develop a plan of action for consideration by the municipal representatives that responds to the information collected and the concerns raised. The plan of action must include a list of expectations for the conduct of the parties, options for proceeding and an assessment of the likely success of those options. [2001, c. 375, §2 (NEW).]

C. A change in the method of sharing costs may only be approved by a majority vote of the municipal representatives present and voting. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

C-1. If a majority of the representatives from each municipality meeting pursuant to paragraph A are unable to agree on a recommendation on what the cost-sharing method for the district should be, within 15 days following the last

meeting a knowledgeable 3rd party must be selected in accordance with rules adopted pursuant to subsection 4, paragraph C. The district is responsible for compensating the 3rd party. The 3rd party shall:

- (1) Prepare a written summary of the process to date, including an assessment of the fairness, accuracy and responsiveness of the recommendations of the facilitator engaged pursuant to paragraph B-1;
- (2) Prepare an impartial recommendation regarding changing the method of cost sharing; and
- (3) Present the summary and recommendations to the municipal representatives for their consideration. [2001, c. 375, §2 (NEW).]

C-2. At an advertised public hearing, the municipal representatives shall solicit public input on the 3rd party's recommendation for cost sharing required under paragraph C-1 and any alternative method or methods proposed by municipal representatives. [2001, c. 375, §2 (NEW).]

D. If a change in the cost-sharing method is approved by a majority of the municipal representatives meeting pursuant to paragraph A, the change must be submitted to the voters at a district meeting. It becomes effective when approved by a majority vote of the district in a district referendum called and held for this purpose in accordance with sections 1351 to 1354, except that, if the proposed change is an alternative cost-sharing plan under subsection 1, paragraph B, subparagraph 4, the change must be approved by a majority of voters voting in a referendum in each municipality in the district instead of in a district referendum. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

E. Assessments made by the school board thereafter must be made in accordance with the new method of sharing costs. [2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD).]

F. The secretary of the district shall notify the state board that the district has voted to change its method of sharing costs. The state board shall issue an amended certificate of organization showing this new method of sharing costs. [1981, c. 693, §§5, 8 (NEW).]

[2001, c. 375, §2 (AMD) .]

4. Departmental assistance. The department shall provide the following services relating to changing district cost-sharing methods:

A. The provision of information and data relating to cost sharing, including, but not limited to, a description of a district's method of cost sharing, the total assessment, the per pupil cost and mills raised for education for district members and the calculation of member costs. The information must be district-specific, comprehensive, easily understood by the general public, presented in graphic and spreadsheet format and available over the Internet. Written copies of the information described and additional information requested must be provided by the department upon receipt of a written request from a district school board or the legislative body of any municipality member of a district; [2001, c. 375, §3 (NEW).]

B. The provision of professional evaluation and assistance to districts and member municipalities considering changes in cost-sharing methods; and [2001, c. 375, §3 (NEW).]

C. The establishment and maintenance of lists of qualified, available individuals to assist districts considering changes in cost-sharing methods as follows:

- (1) Facilitators as required in subsection 3, paragraph B-1; and
- (2) Knowledgeable 3rd parties as required in subsection 3, paragraph C-1.

In establishing the lists, the department shall seek input from the Maine Municipal Association and Maine School Management Association or successor organizations. The department may adopt rules to define the qualifications, responsibilities and selection of individuals on the lists. Rules adopted pursuant to this paragraph are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A. [2001, c. 375, §3 (NEW).]

If you don't have a refrigerator magnet with your E911 address and street address on it, please come to the office to get one. It is very important that everyone in your house knows your E911 number and street name. When calling in for an Emergency, you **MUST** give both. It is also helpful if you can refer to the closest landmark such as Beach # or crossroad. An example would be E911 address 10 Harbor Road (need to give street name) Lot address is 1554.

The ferry employees are not responsible to type in numbers or take verbal requests to use another party's card for passage in any situation. We are now halfway through the high season on the island and the EMS crews have responded to a dozen calls for emergency medical services only a couple of which that have been serious enough to require transport by Raymond Rescue to one of the local hospitals.

I have confidence in the EMS personnel abilities and the way the crews are handling themselves on the calls for service and have heard positive feedback from the Raymond paramedics that have responded to transport our patients. We are here to provide medical care and assistance to the islanders and greatly appreciate the warm response that we have received from most folks.

In an emergency the Vial of Life will speak for you when you can't!

What information does the Vial of Life hold:

A Vial of Life form with your name, date of birth, primary doctors information, medical history, current medications, allergies, etc. This is stored in a baggie on the front of your refrigerator door or in a vial in your refrigerator.



Frye Island EMS is offering the “Vial of Life” program to the island residents. The Vial of Life is designed to speak for you when you can't speak for yourself. The vial contains important medical information that can assist emergency personnel in administering the proper medical treatment.

If you would like to use the Vial of Life call Frye Island EMS Department at 655-8618 for a rescue member to visit your home and help you complete the Vial of Life.



Last week 7 members of the Frye Island Fire Department participated in water rescue training conducted by Cathy Gosselin, our EMS Director. The training was attended by members of the fire and EMS departments in Raymond, Windham, Oxford, and Frye Island, and took place off Tassel Top Beach in Raymond. Two Raymond rescue boats were used, including the red one in the picture, which you may see on the lake from time to time. It is the primary rescue boat on Sebago, and is docked in Raymond. Two pontoon boats were also used, including our own DPW boat, on loan to FIFD for the evening. This was hands-on training, in the water. Rescues were simulated both in shallow water and well off shore, as could happen in a boating accident. Backboards, neck braces, floatation devices and other equipment was demonstrated and used in the drill. A big thanks to Cathy and the Raymond Fire Department for including us in this valuable exercise!

Blood Pressure:

The EMS crews will be doing blood pressure checks on Monday/Wednesday/Fridays from 10 AM to 11 AM down by the Café. Feel free to stop by and have your BP checked!

Emergency Medical Responder Class – The Frye Island EMS division would like to have more folks on the island trained to assist the EMS crews on emergency medical calls. We are looking to find out if there is enough interest to host an Emergency Medical Responder class (EMR) this summer. The class is a 54 hour class and would be held on evenings and a few days scheduled in July and August if we get enough interest. As an EMR, you would be licensed with Maine Emergency Medical Services and would be able to work on the rescue underneath the guidance of an EMT. The class would consist of training on basic first aid, splinting, wound care, controlling bleeding, human anatomy, medical diseases and more. Frye Island Beaches

Frye Island has some of the most beautiful beaches in Maine. They offer great aesthetic value to our community. Increasingly; as our community grows, the non-powered boat storage area at some of the larger beaches is growing. Please remember that only a small number of items; kayaks, canoes, and paddleboats can be stored at very specific locations on the beach.

Additionally, it is extremely important to maintain the quality of these locations by minimizing the space needed for such storage thus leaving the beach available for residential usage. The Town, in an effort to maintain these locations, will begin the process of more closely identifying the storage locations and managing the types of items allowed to be left at the beaches. The Beach Ordinance will be used as a guide. The Town of Frye Island, as well as the Beach Committee, would ask that, as a group, we work to minimize our impact on the beaches with stored items and begin the process of improving those locations by removing items that are not included in the Beach Ordinance. The Town of Frye Island Beach Ordinance is as follows:


- a. No open fires on beaches. (*)
- b. No camping overnight on beaches.
- c. No personal items left on beaches overnight.
- d. NO DOGS on beaches between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm. (Must clean up after your dogs).
- e. No powered watercraft is to be left or tied up on Frye Island Public beaches. Pick up and drop- offs only. No power boats are to enter swimming areas. All power boats accessing Frye Island Public beaches must have a current resident or a temporary rental Frye Island sticker.
- f. Canoes, kayaks, rowboats and paddleboats must be pulled up beyond sandy area, racked, or in designated areas only.
- g. No littering. Use trash containers provided.
- h. Moorings must be out beyond swimming areas, and must not interfere with swim areas. Noncompliance with mooring placement will result in the mooring being removed.

§118 - 4 Violations and Penalties.

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a civil violation and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than five hundred (\$500.00), with each incident being considered a separate violation: all fines accrue to the Town. A warning may be issued for a first offense.

FRYE ISLAND GOLF RANGE

I want to take the liberty to write an open letter to my fellow golfers and islanders about making an island driving range a reality. For some time, Mike Vesprini and I have discussed the merits of having a driving range at the golf club. We believe a driving range would be a great asset for the golf club and the entire Island. As most of you know, there is land set aside for the development of the driving range. We have gotten the support of the golf committee for this project and we are asking the golf community and the island community to support it. We have also gotten help with getting approvals and with planning the project. We want to thank Jon Hartman, Mike Daigle, and Paul Lyons for organizing the Golf Club's 35th anniversary celebration and fundraiser for this project which was held last Saturday. These three good men and their wives, in addition to organizing and purchasing all the food for this event, spent all day preparing the food. I want to thank all of them for their amazing generosity and as a result of their efforts, we received \$1,144 towards this project. We also want to thank Gary Donohue, John Thompson, Chris Gruner, Todd Keigwin, Bob Thurston, Wayne Fournier, Jon Hartman and Rod Beaulieu for helping me with this project and helping in guiding me through the approval process for this project. I also want to thank Dale Frechette for offering to help us with the site work for this project and John Crosby for donating a significant number of range balls for this project! I am touched by all the support and positive feedback for this project.

The driving range will be a great place for all of us to improve our game, provide a real place for golf lessons, will be a real attraction for those looking for something to do who are not golfers, will be a means to keep practice sessions off the course and will provide ancillary income to the golf club for driving range ball sales and more golf club food and beverage sales. Most important to me, in particular, it will be a great place for the youth on our island to learn the game and have some fun.
