Meeting called to order at 8:06 PM by the Clerk of the MSC, Ron Weir.

The meeting was turned over to the Moderator, as elected, William Schumacher. The clerk then administered the swearing in oath to the moderator.

The Agenda for the evening was explained to the membership of the Municipal Services Corporation. Four ballot collectors were solicited to expedite voting and were sworn in: Rene Theriault, Kathy Holgerson, Carol Stenz and Natalie Oxman served as collectors.

Fred Gruner was called forward as nominations chairman and presented Carl Bloom, Len Corwin, and Roger Stenz. Each candidate gave a brief background on themselves to the membership. Ballots were distributed and collected. Results of the election were Carl Bloom and Len Corwin elected for a three year term.

The second item on the agenda was the 1983 operating budget as presented by Robert Mack and Robert Aronson.

Len Corwin made a motion to accept the budget and it was seconded by Ed Charrette. The budget was accepted by a majority of the voters present.

A motion was made by Len Corwin to charge tradesmen for ferry ride and fee to be charged to individual cottage owner, seconded by Ray Paulk. Motion withdrawn.
