

Ferry Pedestrian Policy

Discussion: State law requires that all children 10 years of age and under must wear a type I, II, or III Personal Floatation Device (PFD). To comply with this law and to insure the safety of all pedestrians that use the Frye Island ferry service, the following policies have been established.

Children, 10 years of age and under, when using the ferry as a pedestrian, shall be accompanied by an adult, at least 18 years of age or older, and must wear an approved personal floatation device (PFD). Each pedestrian will be required to have the appropriate ferry ticket for passage.

Infants, 12 months of age and under, may be carried on the ferry at no charge by an adult at least 18 years of age or older with the appropriate ferry ticket for passage. For safety reasons, an adult is permitted to carry only one infant on the ferry. The infant must wear an approved personal floatation device (PFD) in accordance with State law. In addition, children in strollers, carriages, etc. will be required to wear an approved PFD and will need the appropriate ferry ticket for passage.
